*Working Memory: Women and Work in World War II* (Wilfrid Laurier University Press, 2015) speaks to the work women did during the war: the labour of survival, resistance, and collaboration, and the labour of recording, representing, and memorializing these wartime experiences. These efforts are a part of the making of history, and when the process is as personal as many of our contributors' research has been, it is also the working of memory. *Working Memory* brings scholarly attention to the roles of women in World War II that have been hidden, masked, undervalued, or forgotten.
